- questions time and discussions

- arts workshops in "cultural vehicles in education"

- opportunities for participants to present and share their work

- panel discussion focused on the role of the arts and self-development in life-long learning

- presentations from experts in the field of creative life-long learning

- a theatre performance by CVE workshop groups and an exhibition of works of art created by adult learners during the project

By the end of the conference, the participants:

- will be familiar with the concept of cultural vehicles in education

- will learn about efficient and attractive motivational mechanisms for increasing adult

learners' participation in various educational programs and activities

- will discover new methods for educating socially vulnerable groups

- will develop new skills in arts-based adult education

- will be able to transfer the CVE methodology to their practice, both to other potential trainers and to their end-beneficiary groups.

- will learn about new developments in creative adult education

- will have made new contacts for national and international cooperation on relevant areas of interest.
