Open air museum

In the middle of the course you can enjoy a 1 day sightseeing trip to Skanzen – Wallachian Open-Air Museum in Rožnov pod RadhoštěmThe open-air museum founded in 1925 is located on the area of 80 ha and has three separate areas: Dřevěné městečko (Wooden town), Mlýnská dolina (Mill valley) and Valašká dědina (Wallachian village). Within the framework of the programme block Wallachian Year the visitors may select from sixty social anthropology and craftsmen programmes for the children and adults, including four international festivals.

Janackovy Hukvaldy

Which other place could have offered more effective inspiration for the compositional genius of Leoš Janáček, the Hukvaldy native, who grew up here until he was eleven years old. Then he moved to Brno, where he taught at the organ school. Later he bought a small house with a garden in Hukvaldy, which he later bequeathed in his will to the town provided his rooms would remain preserved in their original state.

Today a memorial of Leoš Janáček is located here in the form of an exposition of his life and work. Even Janáček's own music stand and harmonium are here. Hukvaldy Castle and the land around have been the scene of the international music festival "Janáček's Hukvaldy" for several years, visited by many superb musician and music lovers from near and far.

Janackovy hukvaldy is the Janáček's Lašsko Musical Festival that takes place every year in the summer season offering a whole range of open air concerts and plays. One of the evenings during your stay in Beskydy mountains you can look forward to indulge into the open air music experience at the romantic place and also get to know the birth place of a great worldwide known composer.

The world has been inundated with Gipsy kings and Gypsy things in recent years, with every new-age guitarist and French Bobby Darren imitator jumping on to this most peculiar of band wagons. Stodolní Street is the place to be in Ostrava. Over the past fifteen years, the area in and around Stodolní has changed from being an example of what industrial towns should not be, to one of the most attractive areas of the city for young people of all ages. Within the space of just a few blocks, there are more than 80 bars, clubs and restaurants open until the small hours of the morning. A walk down the street on any given night provides a view into many cultures of the wordl, including Irish Bars, Caribbean clubs, Italian restaurants, kebab grills, discos, rock clubs and much, much more... In 2006, the street was reconstructed as a pedestrian zone, and administrative and residential buildings lining the street were modernized.
